







MYSTIC SPIRES SALVIA Salvia longispicata x farinacea 'Balsamisp'






• Deciduous perennial from Mexico • Tall spires of indigo flowers spring to fall • Tolerates heat and humidity


Salvia farinacea 'Augusta Delberg'

• Native semi-evergreen perennial






• Very compact variety • Pink & cream blooms from spring through fall • Heat & drought tolerant



PRIDE OF BARBADOS Caesalpinia pulcherrima






• Large deciduous shrub from the Caribbean • Blooms ALL summer • Loves Texas sun & heat • Dies back in winter & regrows every April

• Covered with white flowers for 9 months • All-time customer










- Stellar Central TX native • Mounding habit • Covered in purple flowers spring - summer

- Deep red flowers from late spring through summer




Russelia equisetiformis

Turk's Cap






Malvaviscus arboreus var. drummondii

Gregg's Blue Mistflower Conoclinium greggii







Texas Lantana








• Deciduous shrub with orange & yellow flowers • Blooms spring - fall • Low maintenance color • Butterflies love it!!! • Birds enjoy berries




• Semi-evergreen shrub from South America • Masses of purple flowers spring - fall • A colorful, informal



Will bloom in summer if irrigated








• Incredible, fast-growing native groundcover • Drought & heat tolerant • Pollinators love it! • Beautiful in containers or over rock walls



Planting Techniques




Sight Selection - How much light does the area receive?
